One day he will return to bring us to be where he is with him for eternity.


The Gathering for the Ascension of Our Lord

LORD, I am sorry for my sins. I believe that for the sake of my LORD Jesus Christ, you will have mercy on me.

FORGIVENESS OF SINS

- M: Upon this your sincere confession, by Christ's command and by his authority, I assure you that your sins are all forgiven. The vacant cross and the empty grave are God's signs to you that he has accepted the sacrifice of his one and only Son. Whoever believes this simple truth of Scripture has eternal life. The LORD is gracious and righteous! The LORD is with you always, even to the very end of the age.
- P: Amen.

M: Let us praise the LORD who has saved us and now rules all things for the good of his Church.

The Word

NEW TESTAMENT READING

In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

⁶ Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

⁷ He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

⁹After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. ¹⁰They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹ "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

Jesus encouraged the little ones to come to him. During this portion of the worship service, the children are invited forward to learn a truth tailored for them.



NEW TESTAMENT READING

4 As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. ² Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. ³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism; ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

⁷ But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. ⁸ This is why it says:

"When he ascended on high, he took many captives and gave gifts to his people."

⁹ (What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions? ¹⁰ He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.) ¹¹ So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

¹⁴ Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. ¹⁵ Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. ¹⁶ From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

GOSPEL READING

M: The Gospel according to St. Luke, chapter twenty-four:

⁴⁴ He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

When Jesus rose from the dead, he made a point of appearing to his disciples on Easter night. He also made a point of connecting all the dots between his death and resurrection and the words of Moses and the Prophets.

The disciples needed to understand the Scriptures because these are the very promises of God. They needed to know that the same God who made those promises was standing before them and would keep all his new promises.

As Jesus prepared them for his Ascension into heaven, he made more promises to his disciples. He would clothe them with power and enable them to be witnesses of all the things they had heard him say and seen him do.

With these promises backing them, and the blessings he gave them as he ascended into heaven, they were filled with so much joy they returned to Jerusalem to praise God for his grace.

Our Response to God's Word¹

- M: In Christ, you have heard the Word of truth, the Gospel of your salvation.
- P: We believe in Christ and trust in the truth he has revealed to us in his Word.
- M: If you are asked, "What do you believe in the Second Article, concerning Jesus Christ?" answer briefly:
- P: I believe that Jesus Christ, true Son of God, has become my Lord.
- M: What does it mean that Jesus has become our Lord?
- P: He has redeemed me from all evil, from sin, death, and the devil.
- M: Before this we had no Lord and King but we were all captive under the power of the devil.
- P: I was condemned to death and entangled in sin and blindness.
- M: When we were created by God the Father, and had received from him all kinds of good things, the devil came and led us into disobedience, sin, death, and all evil. We lay under God's wrath and displeasure, doomed to eternal damnation, as we had deserved.
- P: There was no counsel, no help, and no comfort for us until this only and eternal Son of God, in his unfathomable goodness, had mercy on our misery and wretchedness and came down from heaven to help us.
- M: He has rescued us, poor lost creatures, from the jaws of hell. Jesus alone won us, made us free, and restored us to the Father's favor and grace.
- P: He has taken us as his own, under his protection, in order that he may rule us by his righteousness, wisdom, power, life, and blessedness.
- M: What does it mean that Jesus is our Ascended Lord?
- P: After rising from the grave and defeating death, he ascended into heaven and assumed the power, glory, and honor that were always his in heaven.
- M: The entire Gospel–our salvation and blessedness–rests upon these truths.

¹ Our confession is based on Luther's explanation to the 2nd Article of the Apostles' Creed in his Large Catechism.
